

Russia's Putin defends nuclear energy

Russian president, Vladimir Putin, defended yesterday nuclear power development and the right all nations have to tap this energy resource, although with conditions and international supervision.

"Every country must have the possibility to develop the Pacific atom, this would reduce power poverty develop many states", Putin said to the Interfax Russian news agency.

Nuclear energy contributes "to create conditions for the socioeconomic progress and to improve millions people's quality of life in the planet", he added.

The Kremlin's maximum leader reiterated his recent initiative to create international uranium enrichment centers to allow access to smaller countries without the need for them to develop their own technology.

Indeed this mechanism would be under the watchful eye of: the U.S.A., Russia, China, France, Germany and the United Kingdom, the six countries able to provide management and technological security.
