

Russia contracts for help to remediate naval waste

Russia now has time and funds to clean up the effects of the cold war.

Russia has hired Fluor Ltd. and British Nuclear Group to help clean up nuclear fuel and waste from the nation's naval fleet.

The Russian Foundation for Environmental Safety of Power Engineering hired the two companies to assist with the decommissioning of the retired Russian nuclear-powered naval fleet and associated spent nuclear fuel and radioactive waste management near the Barents Sea ports of Murmansk and Archangelsk, Fluor said Monday.

Fluor and BNG will work with Russian government organization Rosatom as it develops the Russia's program for cleaning up the former Soviet navy's nuclear legacy.
